Started in a workshop taught by Sharon Smith, this rug is an antique pattern of lions and a tree of life, done in a new, creative way. The background is done in squares like a simple quilt, and the hand hooked wool is embellished with silk and beads.

Description

This was a fun quilt to make. Each block is a different gape, providing space for pieced blocks. The applique is all wool on cotton blocks with a lightweight fusing. I did buttonhole stitches with embroidery thread. I used a cotton batting and cotton fabric on the back which I pieced in a block to bring the colors from the front to the back. It was quilted on a long-arm machine. I put this quilt on our four-poster guest bed in autumn.

I did use a small amount of antique paisley in the center of the flowers.
