



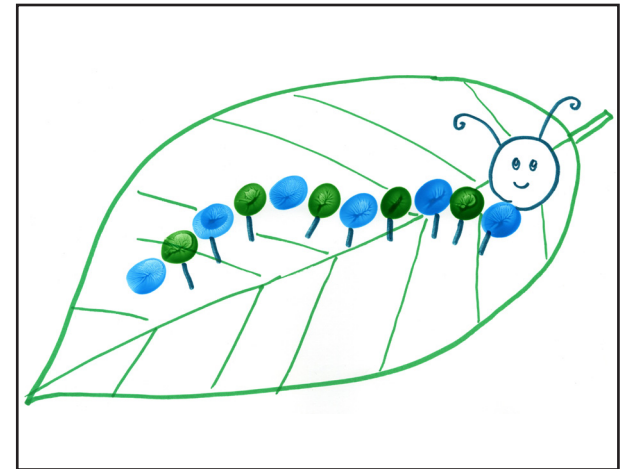
## January

Make two handprints, then draw mittens around the hands. Finish off by drawing snowflakes to create a frosty winter scene.



## February

Have an adult make two handprints in a heart shape using a light color. Next, have the child place their own handprints inside the adult's with a darker color.



## March

Make a caterpillar body using your thumbprints. Add some little legs and a happy smiling face to finish.



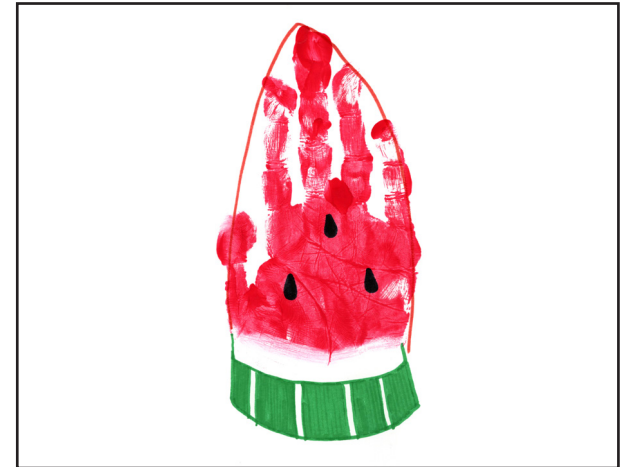
## April

Draw an umbrella in the middle of the page and then tap your fingertips all around to create lots of little raindrops.



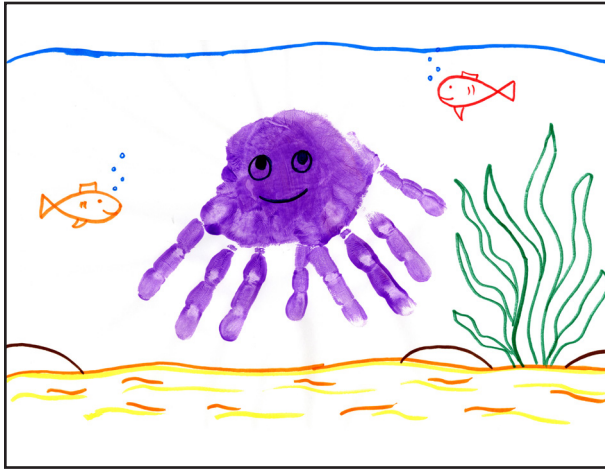
## May

Create the stems of a plant with a green handprint, then draw or use fingerprints to add flowers.



## June

Hold your fingers together to make the red part of a watermelon slice, then draw in a green rind and finish by drawing or using fingerprints for black seeds.



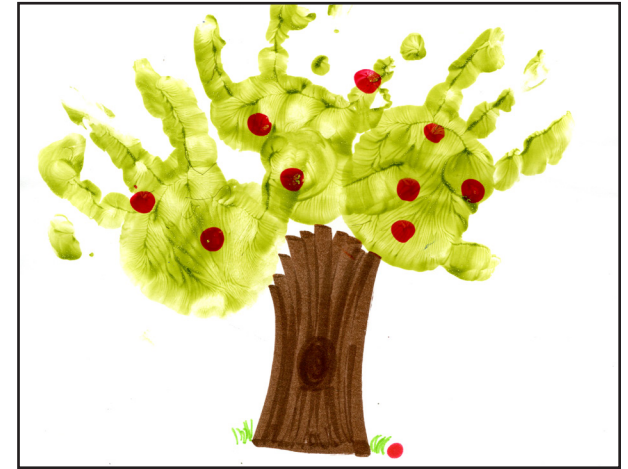
## July

Lift your thumb and make a handprint with only four fingers down. To give the octopus all eight tentacles, place your palm in the same spot, angle your hand, and make another four-fingered print.



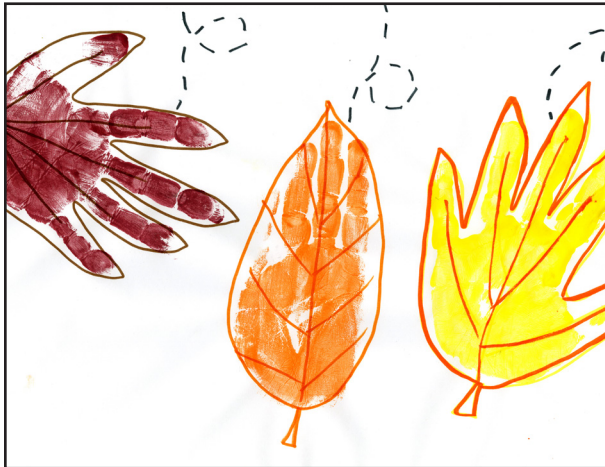
## August

Make a few pink handprints pointing to the side. Add some long necks and legs to make flamingos. Give them accessories for extra fun.



## September

Make this tree with a few green (or yellow or brown) handprints, then add a trunk and some apples.



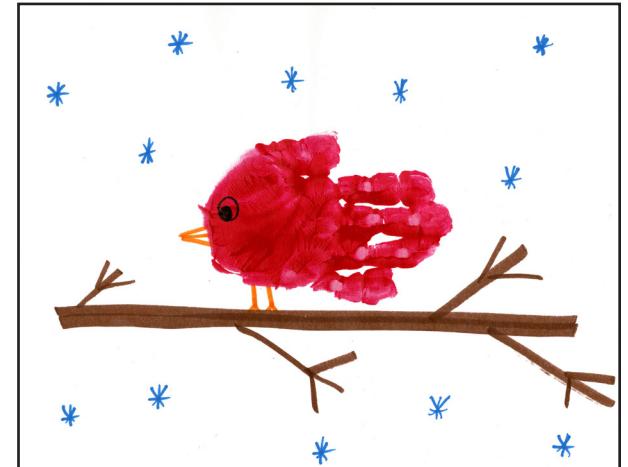
## October

Spread out your fingers to make a maple leaf. Add a stem and veins to complete the look.



## November

Start with your handprint, then add a beak and some legs to your turkey. End with a Thanksgiving or forest scene.



## December

Make a red handprint, and then add a beak and legs to complete your cardinal. Finish the scene with a wintry tree.
